



HELPING COMMUTERS

Conservatives are committed to helping hardworking commuters in Haywards Heath:

■ Fuel duty has been frozen until 2015 - saving the average motorist £11 every time they fill the tank. Petrol is now 20p a litre cheaper then under Labour's plans. Conservatives in Haywards Heath are campaigning for fuel companies to give fairer prices to local motorists.

■ Rail fare rises have been capped at no more than the rate of inflation in 2014.

■ The Government has committed to a further £50million for a full redevelopment of the railway station at Gatwick Airport.

■ £77million improvmenets to the A23 at Handcross are due to be completed next year.

■ A Network Rail study into the Brighton Mainline, including a Lewes-Uckfield connection to create a second mainline is being accelerated.

The long suffering residents of Greenhill Way have seen the building of the relief road on their doorstep and are now faced with having a chunk of East Sussex's houses being dumped next to them, ruining their green open space and adding to congestion.
