



MORE MONEY IN YOUR POCKET WITH THE CONSERVATIVES

Conservatives believe in cutting taxes for hard working families. Because of the tough decisions we are taking to sort out the mess left by Labour, in this year's Budget we announced the biggest ever increase in the tax free personal allowance.

This means an additional tax cut of up to £220 for thousands of taxpayers in Burgess Hill from April 2013 - a total tax cut of £546 since the general election.

From April next year, ordinary hard working people across the country will not pay a penny of income tax on anything they earn under £9,205, taking 2 million people on the lowest incomes out of tax altogether.

Locally, Conservative Councillors have frozen the Council Tax charged by the County and District Councils for the second year.

The Council Tax freeze means the average family is £45 better off compared to a typical increase.

By cutting income tax and freezing Council Tax, thousands of hard working people in Burgess Hill are better off with the Conservatives.
